GREETING

Officiant: God, come to my assistance.

All: Lord, make haste to help me.

All Bow for the first line

Officiant: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

All: As it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.
Alleluia.

The psalms and canticles will be recited in two choirs or groups. Choir 1 includes all those seated on the right side of the church. Choir 2 will include all those on the left side of the church.

PSALMODY

Antiphon 1

All: Lord, have mercy.

Reader: Lord, sin offends you, repentance pleases you,
do not punish us in your wrath even when we have sinned.

All: Lord, have mercy.

Reader: By your death on the cross you opened the gates of heaven,
admit into your kingdom all who hoped in you.

All: Lord, have mercy.

Reader: You opened Paradise to the thief who believed in you,
do not close the gates of heaven to the faithful departed.

All: Lord, have mercy.
